For centuries, the organ was the largest and most complicated machinery invented by humans. The instrument still fascinates students and music lovers of all ages with its thousands of pipes and rich pallet of musical colors. Students will get to listen to demonstrations of the majestic pipe organ at St. Mary’s Church, Milford. They will also receive individual time, if desired, to explore the instrument. Students can bring pieces they have studied on the piano, especially music by Bach, and can try those out on the organ. Expert organist, Frank Zilinyi from the Greater Bridgeport American Guild of Organists will demonstrate how organs work and how they are played. The day will include a free pizza lunch! Piano teachers in Fairfield County and the greater Milford CT Area are encouraged to let their students know about this opportunity to learn about another family of keyboard instruments!
